Ground Rules During Training?



Innovations for Poverty Action(IPA)

- American non-profit organization founded in 2002
- **IPA's research approach:** IPA uses randomized evaluations because they provide the highest quality and most reliable answers to what works and what does not. We also repeat studies in different countries to test if findings are really transferable.
- **Mission:** Innovations for Poverty Action discovers and promotes effective solutions to global poverty problems.
- **Vision:** More evidence, less poverty.



Innovations for Poverty Action(IPA)

- In Uganda IPA was established in 2008.
- IPA Uganda has many evaluations completed or underway in Education, Environment, Health, Finance & Entrepreneurship, and Governance.

Uganda Graduation Study(UGS)



- This **Uganda Graduation study** is about livelihoods and wellbeing of the extremely poor households in the community.
- This study covers approximately **2,600** households in the Kamwenge District in Rwamwanja Refugee area. Half from Host Community and half from within the camp.

General role of Field Managers



- Supervises all field work, ensuring that everyone works effectively and efficiently to collect high quality data.
- Design daily work plans in consultation with Team Leaders and Senior Research Associate.
- Oversees field logistics such as transport, per diem and hiring field guides.
- Informs local authorities of field work and seeks their permission to work in the area .
- Deliver assistance and advice to Team Leaders.

General role of Field Managers-Cont'd



- Ensure all project rules and policies are maintained.
- Evaluate performance of Team Leaders and Field Officers.
- Investigate and resolve any issues resulting from substandard performance.
- Work in the field to check on the progress of each of the data collection teams.
- Perform regular quality checks of the survey data.
- Maintain frequent communication with the Senior Research Associate about daily filed activities and alert him should any issues or questions arise.

Role of Team Leaders



- The Team Leader is responsible for arranging logistics, managing the team's movements, distributing and collecting survey materials, receiving and checking all completed surveys. The Team Leader is responsible for **8** Enumerators and report directly to Field Managers.

Roles of Mobilizers



- The Mobilizer is responsible for moving ahead of the survey team to locate and inform each village/household/respondent about the study. Mobilizers will meet with LC1s and make appointments for the interview with the selected respondents. Mobilizers may also act as trackers as the survey progresses. Mobilizers report directly to the Team Leaders & Field Manager.

Roles of Auditors



The Auditor is responsible for checking that every survey is being conducted to the highest standard. They will review each of the surveys and report any errors or suspicious activity to the Team Leaders. The Auditors will also re-survey randomly selected respondents in order to check that the enumerators are collecting accurate information. The Auditor reports directly to the **FM**.

Roles of Trackers



A tracker is an enumerator who will try to reach the respondents the enumerators were not able to interview. Trackers will be identified either during the training or during the first days of the data collection. Trackers report directly to the **FM**.



Frequently asked questions

- Will I be secured employment after I have successfully completed this training?
- What does it take to be offered employment?
- How will the test be assessed?
- Will I get paid during the training?



Will I be secured employment after I have successfully completed this training?

- No,. Sometimes we invite more people to participate in the training than we need for the study to ensure that we only hire the most qualified people. You should have been informed about whether this training is a part of the hiring process however, if you are in doubt ask the research team for advice.



What does it take to be offered employment?

- IPA only hire the most qualified people. The data we collect has to be of the highest quality so only people with outstanding skills are offered employment.
- If you would like to work for IPA make sure that you work hard during the training, do all your homework, and complete and pass the test. During the training there will be a variety of exercises and tests. The test is like an exam, if you do not pass it you will not be offered employment.



What does it take to be offered employment?-cont'a

- Please note that even if you pass the test you might not be offered employment. Sometimes we invite more people to participate in the training than we need for the study, and sometimes all training participants are qualified. IPA will also keep your name and contact details in our database for future references.
- You will be evaluated on the following areas: Test score, participation and completion of exercises, completion of homework, teamwork, communication/language skills, initiative, punctuality, time management, and attitude.

Will I get paid during the training?



- You will **NOT** receive a wage during the training but you will receive a per diem/Training allowance(will explain in details at the end) which should cover your transport expenses. During the training IPA will provide drinks, snacks and lunch.

What IPA expect from you during the training



- Active participation.
- Ask questions when in doubt.
- Completion of all assignments.
- Successful completion of the test.
- Punctuality.
- Teamwork.

What you can expect from IPA during the Training

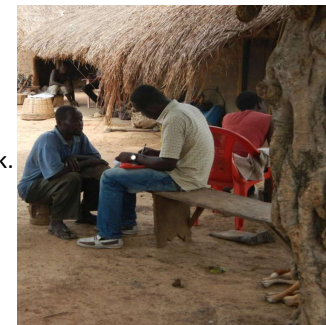


- To be treated fairly and honestly at all times.
- To learn the basic principles of good enumeration.
- To learn how to conduct interviews on Smartphone/tablet.
- To receive feedback regarding what you are doing well and where there is room for improvement.
- To improve your enumeration skills and meet new people.

Your role as a Field Officer



- Your main task is to conduct interviews with selected respondents
- The quality of the data collected will be determined by the quality of your work.



Field Officer Code of Conduct



- You must be courteous towards everyone (the respondent and his/her family and friends, the other members of the team and everyone else involved in the study). Your behaviour can have an enormous influence on people's opinions in the localities covered by the survey.
- You must inform the respondent that all information is strictly confidential.
- You must avoid disturbing or upsetting anyone by your behaviour.
- You must be properly dressed, so that the respondent will be inclined to trust you, as a reliable and responsible person.

Relationship with the Team Leader



- Always follow the advice given to you by your Team Leader.
- You must inform your Team Leader of any difficulties or problems that you encounter.
- Your team leader will also collect and check your work and help you solve any problems that may arise.

Relationship with the Team Leader




- Your Team Leader (or another team member) will carry out the following checks in the field to ensure your work is up to standard:
 - Examine in detail that each interview has been carried out properly and in full.
 - Carry out audits spot checks on the responses you provided.
 - Provide feedback on your work.

Communication




- Everyone on the team **MUST** have phones and everyone will have to use them.
- There should never be a moment where your Team Leader does not know where you are and exactly what you are doing.






Basic rules for telephone use:


- Always have your phone on 24/7.
- Always keep your phone charged.
- Always have airtime on your phone.
- Always answer the phone when a team member calls you (no matter when!).
- Never answer personal calls during interviews.



Interview Protocol


- It is important that you see each interview as a new source of information.
- Avoid treating the interview as a mechanical process.






Who to interview and when?

- The interview should only be carried out with the person(s) listed on the tracking sheet.
- Before you visit the respondent the mobilizer will have paid the respondent a visit and scheduled an appointment for the interview.
- Always make sure to show up for the interview at the scheduled time.





Making contact on the day of survey

Actual contact attempts must be made, either by knocking on the door of the household, calling out, or talking to people you encounter near the household. Simply walking by and thinking that no one is at home cannot be counted as an attempted contact.

<i>If...</i>	<i>Then...</i>
Someone is at home	Speak to the first adult you encounter in the household and ask to speak with the person on the tracking sheet (name the person).
No one answers	Try again or ask neighbour if they know where the person might be.
No one is at home	Ask neighbour if they know where the person might be and when the person will return. Note this down on the tracking sheet. A second attempt will need to be made if the person cannot be found.
Person is not available at the time of the visit	Schedule another appointment with the respondent. Make up to 2 additional visits to obtain the interview.



Explaining the survey and asking for consent

- When you enter a household the first thing you should do is:
 - Greet every one*
 - Introduce yourself*
 - Say that you are working for IPA (Innovations for Poverty Action)*
 - Ask to speak with the person listed on the tracking sheet*
- If the respondent is present you must explain the purpose of the study and the expected length of the survey.
- If the respondent is willing to participate in the study start by reading the consent form.



Explaining the survey and asking for consent-cont'd

- After having read the consent form you ask if the respondents is still interested in participating.
- If the answer is yes, ask the respondent sign or thumb print the consent form and give him/her a copy.
- If the consent is verbal make sure there is a witness.



What if the respondent is reluctant to participate?

- Identify yourself, say that you work for IPA and explain that:
 - You are not trying to sell anything,
 - The purpose of the visit is research only,
 - All information will be held strictly confidential.



What if the respondent is reluctant to participate?



- What if a person who is being contacted is reluctant to participate in the study, and you are not sure why?
- What if the person becomes defensive?
- What if the person asks why we cannot just contact someone else?
- What if the person declines to be interviewed?

Private nature of the interview



Given that some parts of the survey requires privacy, you should ask the respondent at the beginning of the interview to go to a place in the house or on the compound where s/he is least likely to be disturbed



Private nature of the interview



- If another person does not understand and refuses to leave, you must use tact and imagination to try and get rid of him.
 - *Explain as politely as possible that the interview must be conducted in private, and that you are instructed not to begin/continue the interview until you are alone with the respondent.*
 - *Ask the respondent to persuade the other person to leave.*
 - *Try to satisfy the person's curiosity by reading the first few questions (although please avoid sensitive sections), and then say something like "you have heard some of the questions. Will you now excuse us for a little while"?*

Private nature of the interview



The presence of other people during the interview may cause a respondent embarrassment and influence some of his/her answers. Overheard interviews may also cause negative consequences for the respondent later (for example, if someone in his/her household learns that the respondent has personal savings or income and forces him/her to share it). Issues which require privacy include:

- *Health issues*
- *Income*
- *Savings and loans*

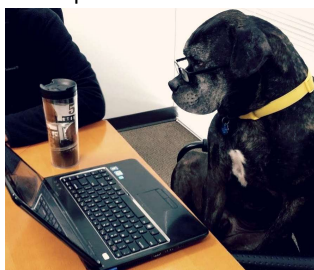
ALWAYS MAKE SURE THAT THE RESPONDENT UNDERSTAND THAT ALL RESPONSES REMAIN CONFIDENTIAL.

How to read the questions to the respondent



Questions should always be read:

- As they are written in the text, unless the question instructions specify 'DO NOT READ' or 'OBSERVE',
- Read out Options Slowly and clearly,
- In a pleasant voice that conveys interest and professionalism, and
- Entirely to make sure the respondent has heard it completely. Do not change the wording or order of the questions.



Tempo of the Interview



- Always remember that every interview is with a new respondent, a person who has NEVER heard the survey questions before.
- Maintain the tempo of the interview.
- Avoid long discussions unless they are necessary for establishing accurate responses but do not to run through the interview too fast either.
- If a digression from the topic happens:
 - *do not interrupt the respondent too suddenly*
 - *listen to what he/she is saying, and*
 - *try lead him/her back to the survey in a respectful and gentle manner*

Objectivity



It is extremely important that you remain absolutely NEUTRAL throughout the interview;

- Do not give any sign of preference to one type of answers or another.
- Always assure the respondent that there is no right or wrong answer.
- Avoid any preconceived ideas about the respondent's ability to answer certain questions or about the kind of answer s/he is likely to give.
- Never suggest an answer or attempt to guess an answer from a vague response.



Probing and 'Don't know' answers



A good enumerator will probe the respondent if s/he has difficulty answering a question.

Do your best to avoid accepting answers like "I don't know" by helping the respondent to consider his/her answer.

When probing:

- *You may NOT rephrase the question another way or ask other questions, unless the instructions in the survey manual specifically give you permission.*
- *You may repeat the question as it is written, or give an example if one is written in the survey manual. Do not make up examples.*

Probing and 'Don't know' answers (continued)



You will need to probe further to get an appropriate response when the respondent:

- Seems to understand the question but gives an inappropriate response,
- Does not seem to understand the question, or does not seem to have heard the question,
- Is unable to answer the question asked (e.g. say s/he doesn't know the answer),
- Misinterprets the question,
- Gives incomplete information or an answer that is unclear,

Probing and 'Don't know' answers (continued)



- Is taking a long time to answer the question and/or hesitates
- Asks for a specific part of the question to be repeated (in this case, read the whole question again),
- Asks for one choice to be repeated (in this case, read all the choices again),
- Answers too quickly when you know the question requires time to answer,
- If the respondent gives the same answer repeatedly for different questions, or
- If the respondent gives you two or more answers for the same question.

Probing and 'Don't know' answers (continued)



Be careful to maintain neutrality in probing. If the respondent gives an ambiguous answer, your probes should be similar to the following neutral probes:

"Can you explain a little more?"

"I did not quite hear you; could you please tell me again?"

"There is no hurry. Take a moment to think about it."

"Remember, there is no right or wrong answer."

Survey fatigue and feedback



Sometimes, especially if the survey is long, respondents start to get bored and provide irrelevant responses or respond 'I don't know'.

Feedback may be useful when the respondent:

- *Needs to focus and get his/her attention back on the question.*
- *Is digressing from the topic.*
- *Is making inappropriate or personal enquiries, or*
- *Is performing well: listens attentively and answers appropriately.*

Useful feedback techniques



- Vary the type of feedback by using different phrases (e.g. great, excellent, good etc.),
- Pause briefly after feedback,
- Give verbal as well as non-verbal feedback, such as a smile or a nod,
- Use short feedback sentences for short responses and longer feedback sentences for longer responses, and
- Keep eye contact while providing feedback.

Accuracy checks



You need to think about each answer the respondent provides in the context of previous responses and your surroundings.

Always ask yourself: *Does the answer make sense in the context of this household and in the local environment?*

If you suspect that the respondent is not answering as accurately;



Then encourage him/her to re-focus by discussing his/her questionable responses in greater depth. If this continues, then complete the survey, make a note on the tracking sheet regarding your doubts about the respondent's truthfulness, and contact your Team Leader immediately.

Interruptions



Interruptions may occur during the interview. For example????

- Take care that even if interrupted or delayed, you should remain patient and polite at all times.
- If they become too long or too many, suggest returning at another time to complete the interview.

Numbers and amounts



There will likely be questions in the survey where you will have to record amounts such as questions concerning income, savings or loans.

- If it is difficult for the respondent to add up the values it is your job as enumerators to help in doing so.
- Use a pen and paper or your notebook.
- Only use the calculator on your phone when you really need them, we don't want it to become a disturbing element in the interview.

When helping the respondents to make calculations



- 1) Be sure not to skip to conclusions too early!
- 2) Do not offend any respondent by taking for granted that they cannot make the calculations themselves (but always check that the calculations are correct).
- 3) Always probe sufficiently before you start calculating, to make sure that all expenses are accounted for, and then start adding up the amounts.

The Work



- This section provides you with practical details such as working hours and days, weekly schedule as well as a check list of materials and daily tasks.

Practical details



Working days

- During the data collection period you will work Monday through Saturday. Sundays are always off and you are free to do whatever you wish to.

Working hours

- The working hours are 7.10 am to approx. 6pm. You must be present at the office before 7:10 am. Please don't be late. You will leave the office for interviews by 7:15am each morning and will sometimes not return until 6 or 7 pm or even 8pm.



Practical details-Cont'd

Surveys per day

- You are expected to conduct approximately **3** surveys per day.

Be prepared

- You will often be working in very rural and remote areas. You should therefore always wear comfortable shoes that are easy to walk in. You should also take good care of the supplies you are given: smart phone/tablets, paper copies of the survey, pens, clip boards, folders etc. and have them with you at all times. You will be given a back pack so you can keep all of your supplies in one place.



Practical details

Commitment:

- We expect every team member to work for the duration of the contract. Keep in mind that if you decide to leave before the end of your contract you will not only let your team members down, you will also lose out on a very significant portion of your salary. If you have to leave for family and personal emergencies we support you in this.

Pay attention to detail

- There are many things you have to get familiar with and learn, from clicking the right buttons on the smart phone/tablet to filling pages of notes. We expect that you will pay attention and complete every detail.

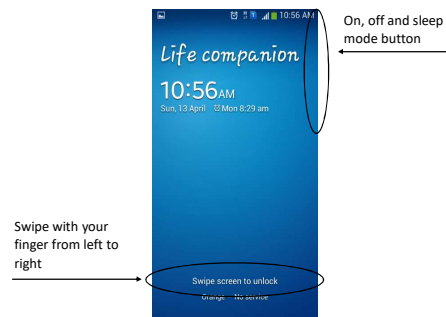



OPEN DATA KIT (ODK) AND SURVEY CTO

Open Data Kit and Survey CTO are two computerized programs which allow the data collection (i.e. interviews) to be conducted using either a smartphone or a tablet.




How to use a smartphone/tablet







How to open ODK/ Survey CTO


Survey CTO and ODK work in similar ways however the app looks different. To open either of the programs go to the home screen of the device and tap on the program icon with your finger once.






How to get a blank form from the server






How to get a blank form from the server


You might be able to get more than one form. Mark the form your Team Leader has asked you to get and tab 'Get Selected'





How to open a new form

Every time a new interview starts a new form has to be opened on the device.

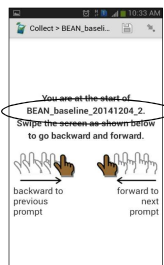




How to open a new form (continued)

This is the first screen of the survey. Always check that you are using the correct form. If you tapped on the wrong form go and tap on the right form.

Check the name of the form to ensure that you are using the correct form



Filling in a form

- To go from one question to another you swipe from right to left.
- Most questions are required: **'Sorry, this response is required'**
- Read the question that shows on the screen except if it explicitly says: DO NOT READ or READ OUT or OBSERVE
- Underneath each question there are answer options provided **or** space for entering the answer if the question does not have a pre-coded answer.



How to change a response

If you **have not** swiped to another question:

- Tap once on the wanted choice until the blue dot appear.
- If you are able to select more than one answer (i.e. the question is of the type 'select multiple') you reverse the selection by tapping once on the answer which was incorrectly chosen so the blue dot disappear.
- If the blue dot does not disappear tap again until it disappears.
- Once you are certain that the right answer option has been selected you can move to the next question by swiping the screen from right to left




How to change a response (continued)

If you **have** swiped to another question

First have to go back to the specific question:

- Tap on the arrow looking icon with a dot in the top right corner of the device (within SurveyCTO or ODK).
- The whole survey will appear in a list form.
- Scroll up to the question you where wish to change the response.
- Tap on the question – the question will appear in full.







How to change a response (continued)


If you **have** swiped to another question (continued)

- Once you have found the specific question:
- Hold your finger down on the response until the message 'Edit Prompt' appear with the text 'remove response'.
- Tap 'Remove response'.
- A new message will then appear with the text 'Remove This Response?' followed by a text specific to the question.
- Tap on 'Remove response' and the response will be removed. You can now enter a new response.



How to change a response (continued)





How to change a response (continued)


If you **have** swiped to another question (continued)

To go back to the question you were just at (if you were not at the end of the survey).

- Tap on the arrow looking icon with a dot in the top right corner of the device again.
- When you see the survey in list form scroll down to the question you were at when you decided to change/correct an earlier recoded response.


To go to the end of the survey

- Tap on the arrow looking icon with a dot in the top right corner of the device again.
- When you see the survey in list form scroll down to the end and save the survey.



Saving a form and editing a partly filled form

To save the form tap the floppy disk icon in the top right of the screen.

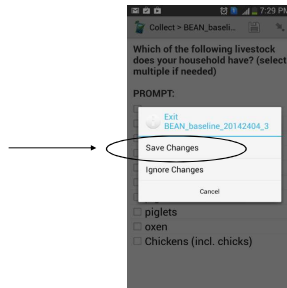


ALWAYS note down the date and time you saved the form on the tracking sheet, as well as the device number on which the survey is being done.



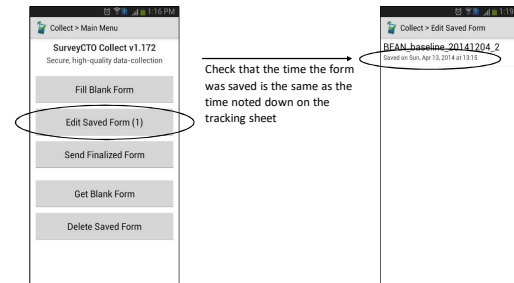
Saving a form and editing a partly filled form (continued)

You can also save a form by tapping the ‘back’ button. Press save if you wish to save the form and exit, press Cancel if you hit the back button by mistake and you did not intend to exit the survey



Saving a form and editing a partly filled form (continued)

To edit the form you saved: Go to the Menu screen of Survey CTO and tab on “Edit Saved Form”



How to finalize and save the form

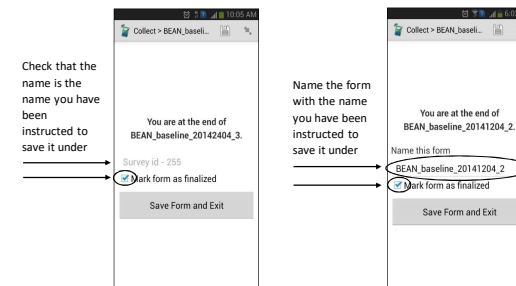
After answering the last question in a form, you have to ‘finalize’ the form, so that it can no longer be edited, and is ready to be s end.


- ‘Mark form as finalized’.
- Before you finalize the form and click Save Form and Exit you must check that the name of the form is the name you have been instructed to save it under.
- Sometimes you might have to enter the name yourself.
 - Tap once behind the name
 - Delete the text
 - Enter the correct form name
- Tap ‘Save Form and Exit’.

Now you are ready to start a new interview.




How to finalize and save the form





Don'ts in the Field

1. No Alcohol/Smoking when in the field.
2. Never do any kind of business in the field.
3. fighting/Quarrels in the field is prohibited.
4. Gambling and the like is not allowed.
5. No using Vehicles for non project activities.
6. No relationships (both with respondents and within the team).
7. No Media Engagement.
8. Never promise a respondent what IPA cant deliver.




Important items Field Officers should have;

- PDAs
- Tracking sheets
- Bag
- Raincoat
- Manuals(Survey & Training)
- Helmets(for Mobilizers, Auditors, Trackers.
- IPA ID CARD
- Approval letters
- Gift for Respondents (soap)
- Team contact list



Questions?



Interview Procedure

Step 1: Ask to speak with the household head, the person who usually makes the most important decisions in the household. This person has been found for you by the mobilizer.

Step 2: If household head is not available, ask to speak with “2nd household head.” This person has also been found for you by the mobilizer.

Step 3: If 2nd household head is not available, ask to speak to participant.



Interview Procedure (Cont)

- **Step 4:** If participant is not available, ask to speak to an alternative participant. This should be an economically active female 17 years or older. Ask the household to choose somebody who is likely to participate in a livelihoods program.
- **Step 5:** If alternative participant is not available, reschedule with participant.
- **Step 6:** If participant is not available to be rescheduled, please speak with your team leader. This household may need to be replaced.



Interview Procedure (Cont)

- Step 7:** If household head and participant are available, interview household head for household section and participant for individual section. The tablet will prompt you when the survey switches.
- Step 8:** If household head is available and participant is not, but was successfully rescheduled, interview household head for household section.
- Step 9:** If household head is not available but participant is available, ask if participant is knowledgeable about household affairs. If yes, interview participant for both sections.



Interview Procedure (Cont)

- Step 9b:** If participant is **not knowledgeable about household affairs**, interview participant for participant section only.
- Step 10:** If participant **was not successfully rescheduled**, **do not interview anyone. Report this to team leader. Household may need to be replaced.**

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This document outlines the plans for data collection and analysis related to experiments of the AVSI Graduation to Resilience Program in Kamwenge, Uganda. The first part describes the plan for the Cohort-2 experiments that are related to the second cohort of AVSI's program that is starting now in early 2022. The second describes the plan for the long-term follow-up with study participants of Cohort 1 for which the original intervention period ended in 2021.

1. GRADUATING TO RESILIENCE COHORT 2 STUDY DESIGN

We organize the description of the Cohort-2 study in two parts, referred to here as Trial A and Trial B. Trial A focuses on estimating the impacts on participants of the second cohort of the AVSI Graduation program in Kamwenge relative to a control group of households that were not offered participation in the program. Trial B focuses on estimating the additional impact of an interpersonal group therapy (“IPTG”) above and beyond the impact of the regular Cohort-2 program (“Regular”). Trial A and Trial B take place with similar but slightly different study populations due to constraints on the number of the available study participants, the target participant numbers for AVSI and the need to accommodate the long term study of Cohort-1 impacts.

1.1 Trial A: Regular Graduation Vs. No Graduation

In Trial A we compare households that were randomly selected to be offered participation in AVSI’s second cohort of the Kamwenge Graduation program. The sample for this study are former Cohort-1 control households who were evaluated for Cohort-2 eligibility and then randomized into Treatment and Control. Details of the sampling strategy and recruitment of study participants are available in the separate “Sampling Plan” document. Households were randomized using code written by IPA and the list of households assigned to Treatment were sent to AVSI.

Table 1 below gives an overview of the number of households in each experimental arm. In total, Trial A has 2,662 participants, about evenly distributed into Treatment and Control. Randomization was done at the household level, stratified by village clusters, and was done using re-randomization to ensure balance of baseline values of basic household characteristics.

Note that since AVSI required that for programmatic reasons half of all “intervention groups”, which program households are organized in by AVSI, participate in IPTG and half do not. Since in many villages there is only one intervention group, which typically contain 20-30 households, and the trial is of limited size, the estimates of the impact of Treatment in this trial will reflect an average of treatment effects for households participating in the IPTG version of the program and for those that participate in the regular program.

1.2 Trial B: Regular Graduation Vs. Regular Graduation + IPTG

In Trial B we compare households receiving the AVSI graduation program with additional interpersonal group therapy sessions (T-IPGT) and households receiving the “regular” graduation program without additional IPGT sessions (T-reg). Study participants are sampled from both former Cohort-1 control

households and former Cohort-1 holdout control households. As above, the details of the sampling strategy and recruitment of study participants are available in the separate “Sampling Plan” document.

Table 2 below gives an overview of the number of households in each experimental arm of Trial B. In total, Trial B has about 3,210 participants, evenly distributed across the two experimental groups. Households were randomized using code written by IPA and information about which households were in the regular vs the IPGT groups were sent to AVSI. Randomization was done analogously to Trial A.

Estimation of treatment effects for Trial B will first focus on short-term effects on mental health-related outcomes with a short-run midline survey timed about three after the end of the IPGT sessions. Analysis of follow-up data, collected both via additional surveys (potentially via phone surveys) about a year into the program and as part of AVSI monitoring data, will document potential effects of the add-on group therapy sessions on economic activity. If we find sufficiently large differences between the two experimental groups at these intermediate analysis steps, additional data collection and analysis at the end of the program with the full sample will proceed along the same lines as for Trial A, documenting differences between the two experimental groups on measures of economic activity and household welfare as described above.

2. GRADUATING TO RESILIENCE COHORT 1 LONG-TERM FOLLOW-UP STUDY DESIGN

For the analysis of long-term effects of the Cohort-1 treatment arms, study participants of the previous follow-up surveys will be visited again for another round of interviews timed to take place together with endline data collection for Cohort 2. The primary outcomes of interest will be the same as for the recently completed endline of Cohort 1, which focussed on consumption, food security, productive assets, income and subjective well-being. In addition, as before, we will collect anthropometric measures of children to document impacts on stunting and wasting both for young children at the time of the long-term follow-up and for children who were born during the initial implementation period.

The maximum sample size available for the long-term follow-up will be smaller than for the recently completed endline data collection. This is because both former Cohort-1 Control households in Cohort-1 Treatment villages and households in some former Cohort-1 Control villages were offered participation in the program of Cohort 2. This was necessary to reach AVSI’s target participant numbers for Cohort 2 and provided a chance for control households of the prior study to participate in the program in this second cohort. However, the drop in the control household sample size available for long-term follow-up will decrease the precision of estimates of the long-term impact.

Table 3 below gives an overview of the maximum number of participants available for long-term follow-up. Study households are located in 21 and 36 Treatment villages in the refugee and host communities, respectively. In the refugee community, 14 former Cohort 1 control villages were randomly selected to be dropped from the study and “converted” to Cohort-2-only villages (leaving 7 Control villages for long-term follow-up); in the host community the number was 4 (leaving 32 Control villages).

In order to maintain the integrity of the Cohort-1 trial, both treatment and control villages and households of the first cohort needed to be “treated” equally with respect to recruitment of households (and villages) into participation in the Cohort-2 intervention. Therefore, we evenly distributed Cohort-2 participants across both Cohort-1 treatment and remaining control villages. In order to maintain a control group for Cohort-1, and to have a control group for Cohort 2, about half of the former Cohort-1 controls who were found to be eligible for Cohort 2 were randomized to remain Control with the other half getting offers for participation in Cohort 2 programming — stratified by village. In addition, a share of Cohort 1 hold-out controls who were found eligible for participation in Cohort-2 were selected to receive an offer to participate in Cohort 2. This share was applied equally between Cohort-1 Treatment and Control villages.

3. DATA ANALYSIS FOR COHORT 2 AND COHORT 1 LT

Estimation of treatment effects will focus on key measures of economic activity and household welfare measured at the end of the approximately two-year program. Impact estimates will primarily be estimated based on mean regressions that control baseline values of the outcomes of interest or their proxies as well as relevant stratification cell fixed effects and re-randomization variables. The key outcomes mirror the primary outcomes of interest of Cohort 1:

- Consumption per capita (\$)
- A food security index based on FCS and HFIAS
- Value of productive assets (\$)
- Household income (\$) based on all sources
- Subjective well-being index based on questions related to life satisfaction mental health

Note that we do not plan to collect anthropometric measures given the short time frame of follow up and the results from Cohort 1.

Secondary outcomes include information on knowledge about and practices related to program components (WASH, nutrition, etc), savings and other financial outcomes, mental health, nutritional status, kids’ schooling, travel and migration, inter-group attitudes, social capital, among other outcomes.

Limited follow-up data will be collected during a midline round of surveying since the short-term effects have been documented well in Cohort-1. As such midline survey measurement will focus on program participation, basic indicators of economic activity, and short-form measures of food security and productive assets ownership and will be conducted on a random subsample of study participants.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This document summarizes the study protocol for the Graduating to Resilience Cohort 2 study in Uganda. The intervention is implemented by AVSI, and evaluated by Innovations for Poverty Action (IPA). The protocol includes the following documents:

- Sampling plan
- Monitoring plan for fieldwork
- Field manuals (Annex A)
- Survey instrument (Annex B)

Please note that the pre-analysis plan will be added to the study protocol in 10 January 2022.

1. GRADUATING TO RESILIENCE COHORT 2 STUDY DESIGN

For Cohort 2, AVSI had a target of 7,200 participant households, split half by refugee and community. To accommodate the target numbers while preserving the integrity of the Cohort-1 design, the goal was to keep as many control villages in the study as possible while distributing Cohort 2 participants evenly across Cohort-1 treatment and control villages that are not being dropped. The latter ensures comparability between Cohort 1 treatment and control villages at later follow-up surveys. To implement the above strategy, we calibrated the number of study villages and samples sizes in two parallel steps.

First, some Cohort-1 control villages were dropped from the list of villages that are part of the Cohort-1 long-term study. In those ‘given up’ villages, all households were considered as recruitable for AVSI’s Cohort-2 intervention. The list of all households found to be eligible as part of AVSI’s Cohort-1 assessment was transmitted to AVSI, including both those recruited into the Cohort-1 study as controls as well as those considered hold-out controls that were assessed at the time but not recruited for the Cohort-1 study. In the refugee community, 14 former Cohort 1 control villages were randomly selected to be dropped from the study and “converted” to Cohort-2-only villages; in the host community the number was 4.

Second, we evenly distributed Cohort-2 participants across both Cohort-1 treatment and remaining control villages. In order to maintain a control group for Cohort-1, and to have a control group for Cohort 2, about 50% of the former Cohort-1 controls who were found to be eligible for Cohort 2 (see next section) were randomized to remain control with the other half getting offers for participation in Cohort 2 programming. In addition, a large share (equal between treatment and control villages) of Cohort 1 hold-out controls who were found eligible for participation in Cohort-2 were selected to receive an offer to participate in Cohort 2. Additional details of the assignment to Cohort-2 are described in the next section.

1.1 Sampling strategy for Cohort 2

We are conducting a study with 5,871 households for Cohort 2. This study is organized in two parts, referred to here as Trial A and Trial B.

1.2 Trial A

The first trial, trial A, compares households who are offered participation in AVSI’s graduation program (T) with control households (C) who are not offered the opportunity to participate. The sample of households for this trial are prior Cohort-1 control households who reside in Cohort-1 long-term (“C1LT”) study villages and were assessed by AVSI to be eligible for Cohort 2.

AVSI assessed eligibility by, first, administering a short scorecard questionnaire and calculating an eligibility score. Then, AVSI completed a bucketing exercise with community members.

Eligible households were those which:

- Had a score card total score that was less than or equal to 5 and were bucketed as ‘moderate’ or poorer.
- Had a score card total score that was less than or equals to 6 and were bucketed as poor or extremely poor.

Table 1 shows the number of households who are part of Trial A. Since all were part of the sample for the Cohort-1 endline, the same endline will serve as the baseline from the perspective of Cohort-2 Trial A.

1.3 Trial B

The second trial, trial B, compares households receiving the graduation program and interpersonal group therapy sessions (T-IPGT) with households receiving the “regular” graduation program without additional IPGT sessions (T-reg). These are sampled from both former Cohort 1 control households and former holdout control households. Holdout control households are households that had been listed as eligible during the Cohort 1 assessments but were not recruited in the Cohort 1 study.

Among refugees, this trial only takes place in former Cohort-1 Control villages that have been dropped from the C1LT study (see first section in this document). These villages are Cohort 1 control villages for which we decided that all the households previously listed at Cohort 1 could be assessed for eligibility, and if eligible, be part of the program. In C1LT control villages, all the former Cohort-1 control households and a large share of the former holdout controls will be randomized (the share is slightly below 1 in order to maintain equality between C1LT T and C villages) but only a subsample of the holdout group was sampled for recruitment into the Cohort-2 study and surveying with a baseline. For former Cohort-1 control households in dropped coh1 control villages, the recent Cohort 1 endline serves as the baseline for Cohort 2.

In the host community, the participants in the trial B are both from controls and holdouts in dropped C1 control villages, and they holdouts (only) in C1 LT villages.

AVSI conducted a poverty assessment for these households as well (for the criteria, see description of Trial A above).

2. MONITORING PLAN FOR FIELDWORK

2.1 Introduction

This section lists field monitoring activities for data collection of the baseline evaluation for the AVSI Graduating to Resilience Psychotherapy Project implemented in the Rwamwanja Refugee Settlement, in Kamwenge District, Uganda, in November and December 2021.

2.2 Team Composition

Principal Investigators (PI)

The PIs will provide overall direction of the baseline data collection activities and ensure that the team is meeting all the targets for the project. The PIs for this project are Dean Karlan, Christopher Udry, Lasse Brune, Nathanael Goldberg and Doug Parkerson.

Research Coordinator (RC) and Research Associate (RA)

The RC will work with RAs to implement field activities. RAs are responsible for overseeing the implementation of field activities and data verification. Antoine Guilhin is the RA for this project.

Field Manager (FM)

The FM will provide field support by monitoring data collection conducted by the field teams. The FM will accompany the teams to the field and ensure that the teams are following field protocols as set in the training manual and respondent replacement procedures. Edmund Emulu is the FM on this project.

Team Leaders and Field Officers (FOs)

The field team consists of four team leaders and 38 enumerators which are divided into four smaller teams. Two teams survey respondents in the refugee settlement and in the host community respectively. In both settlement and host community, there is one team having ten enumerators and another team with nine enumerators. The teams are responsible for conducting interviews in the assigned villages and the supervisors will ensure that enumerators are conducting the assigned interviews. Furthermore, the team leaders are the first contact for enumerators that face challenges. There are two backcheckers/auditors assigned to the four teams who are responsible for interview verification. One auditor is working in the refugee settlement and one in the host community. Below is the composition of field teams for each district. Additionally, in total eight mobilisers are split equally between settlement and host community. They visit the respondents ahead of the survey date to ensure that respondents are available when the enumerators come for data collection. They also determine the household member who will be the participant.

2.3 Monitoring Activities

To adhere to the highest data quality standards, IPA performs a series of data quality measures and fieldwork monitoring activities. These are outlined below in more detail.

High Frequency Checks (HFCs)

High-frequency checks are checks of some elements of the data collection process, complemented daily as new data comes in. At IPA, high-frequency checks are implemented in Stata. They provide insight into ongoing field team and data quality concerns before they become too entrenched to manage.

- Performed on all completed surveys on a daily basis
- Check for Field Officer effects and patterns
- Check for outliers, duplicates, response frequencies and other project-specific data quality issues
- Help analyze compliance with ethics requirements

Back checks

Back checks are an additional measure for monitoring enumerator performance and ensuring high quality data collection and refer to when a highly qualified Field Officer visits a respondent a second time to re-administer a selection of questions from the original questionnaire.

- To be conducted within one or two days after the survey is conducted
- 10% of all surveys with a possibility of 15% in the beginning of data collection
- Surveys for back check to be selected randomly making sure that every enumerator is back checked

Checking Daily Targets/Quotas

- Daily verification of interviews done by FOs
- Following up on FOs with number of interviews below the mean and clarification on issues contributing to not meeting targets

Daily Feedback to the Field Teams

- Provide feedback to the teams and FOs based on observations from daily checks and HFCs
- Highlighting questions that need more focus in the field
- Getting updates from supervisors on challenges faces on the previous day of fieldwork
- Following up on observation by backcheckers and clarifying specific questions with the teams and specific FOs
